



Kirk Fridrich Associate Director of Athletics Head Football Coach

Kirk Fridrich joined the Union Athletic Department as Assistant Athletic Director and head football coach in January of 2007, returning to Union after a five-year absence. Fridrich was an assistant varsity coach for the Redskins from 1993-2001, leaving to accept the head football coaching position at Stillwater Public Schools where he remained until 2005. In 2006, Coach Fridrich became the head football coach for Owasso Public Schools, where he led the Owasso Rams to the 2006 6A State Semi-Finals.

In his 5 years as head coach at Union, Kirk has led the Union Redskins to a record of 65-5, with 5 state final appearances and 4 championships.

In 2011, the Redskins won their 4^{th} title ("4-peat") and their 8^{th} state title in school history.

Coach Fridrich earned a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Tulsa and Master of Science degree from Oklahoma State University.
